This year's annual DY356Day will take place on Sunday, **September 18th**. This is a 356 Registry event that takes place all over the world. It occurs on the Sunday closest to Ferry Porsche's birthday (Sept. 19). The idea behind this event is to get everyone owning 356s to go out and drive them and then document the excursion with photos to be printed in the *356 Registry* magazine or posted online.

The SAR connection to this event started when SAR's own Charter Member, Jeff Gamble suggested that an appropriate day for the drive would be Ferry's birthday. The first DY356 Day took place on September 21, 1999, in multiple spots around the world. In Tucson, six 356s from the Arizona Outlaws made the drive. Decades later, Jeff commented that: "It is wonderful that through the efforts of Gordon, this is now a worldwide event that has taken on a life of its own." (Gordon Maltby was the *356 Registry* magazine's editor until 2018)

No organized Tucson DY356D has been planned this year ... but we hope to see some of these great classic Porsches out and about around Tucson. Keep the Faith. Drive that 356! Take pictures!

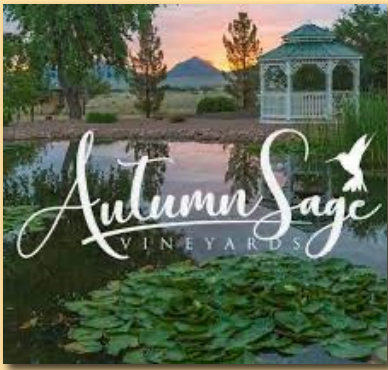

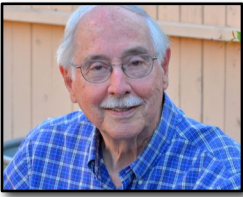

Speed Bump - Slow Down For Some Automotive Tales

The Second Time in 30 Years

After she answered the phone, this sweet young voice said, "I'm Amanda. How may I help you?"

I responded, "I just paid my charges over the internet. The return receipt showed that I have overpaid by \$74. It listed this phone number if I had any questions. Is it possible to have that amount returned?"

Is this Harold?" she asked politely, "Yes, there has been an overcharge. Our apologies. You should have a correction on your credit card in 7-10 days. Is there anything else I can help with?"

"Wow," I thought, "Such amazing and polite service." Of course, I had listed my phone number on the payment, but this response surprised me. Who would have thought that there would be such great service from the Santa Cruz County Justice Court?

I have driven Porsches for 63 years. This was the second Porsche speeding ticket I have been given in that time. The first was about 30 years ago. I was snagged by one of these ubiquitous traffic cameras in Tucson. I was driving my 1985 Porsche 944 east along the stretch of River Road where it swings south on to Alvernon. It was midday and little traffic. I don't remember how fast I was recorded but the fine was minimal. (Years ago, I did get another ticket. My Honda Accord was stopped in an Oklahoma, small town, speed trap - paid on the spot.)

My significant other (what a lousy term for Sweetie), Karma, likes to take Porsche Sunday drives. Often, it's all around Tucson and east on Speedway to the end, over the humps and dips. Or, we will take Old Spanish Trail to Colossal Cave or maybe Gate's Pass to Saguaro National Park West. All are fun Porsche roads.

We also like to head south to the wine country of Sonoita and Elgin. We like Autumn Sage winery, as noted in a previous Speed Bump article. This time of the year you have to consider the monsoon weather.

Recently we decided to take the 2009 Boxster for lunch in Sonoita. On SR 83 south from I 10 we could see a heavy storm cell to the southeast. It seemed to be over the Sierra Vista area. We couldn't tell if it was coming our way. So, we decided to head west from Sonoita on SR 82 to Patagonia.



Traffic was light along this lush stretch of road. We were pattering along at 65 miles an hour when flashing red and blue lights appeared behind us.

State Trooper J. George was very polite. He said, "I have you on radar at 10 miles above the speed limit of 55. Please show me your driver's license." Oh, I thought, I didn't see that sign. That must have been when Karma was telling me how she curtsied when she was introduced to Prince Philip at the Opera in London.

He took my registration and insurance papers to fill out the forms in his patrol car. When he handed them back, he said, "Mr. Tretbar, you must be taking your lady friend to lunch. I have to give you this summons because of the high number of accidents along here. This is the least serious charge. I suggest you just pay the fine. There will be no points on your insurance. Have a nice day and drive safely." I looked at Karma, "Well, that made our day more interesting."

The fine was \$184.00 with refunds of \$24 and \$74 for transaction fees. The final tally was \$86 including a service fee of \$24.

We did return to Sonoita for lunch at our favorite place, The Café, on the east side of town. There was some gentle rain on the way home.

Rocky Mountain Region's (RMR) Grand Loop Tour

Southwest Colorado, July 27-30, 2022

The Shryocks and Millers joined RMR's Grand Loop Tour that started in Fort Collins, CO early Wednesday morning, traversing north to Wyoming before going west with a lunch stop in Riverside, WY. After lunch they proceeded southwesterly dropping back into Colorado via Craig, Rifle and on to Palisade (an eastern suburb of Grand Junction) for the next two nights. This is where Greg and I joined the tour after dropping off Greg's elderly parents at his sister's place in Nucla (a small town in southwestern Colorado) for the duration of the tour.



After a long day of driving Wednesday, Thursday was spent touring a variety of sites Palisade has to offer - the many vineyards, orchards, and an alpaca farm to boot. A local tour bus company provided 3 tour buses to take us to our selected tours with a lunch break at one of the local distilleries. The main

interests of the entire group were the wineries, which got split into two groups between the dry and sweet wines, and the alpaca farm. Greg and I chose to start with the alpaca farm, where we were introduced to the alpacas and some of us

were able to walk one of the leashed alpacas around the orchard and learn more about these animals and their fur/fiber that can be spun into yarn. This farm has one of the few mills in the country and can still do all of this on site. Our tour bus group also did a few stops to some local wineries after lunch before returning to the Wine Country Inn.



Friday, the group packed up our Porsches and headed toward our next two-night stop in Durango. On the way, we stopped in Gateway to tour the Gateway Automobile Museum. This is a fabulous museum of the personal collection of John Hendricks, founder of the Discovery Channel, capturing about 100 years of the American automobile history. After our lunch at the museum, we headed west and south through small rural towns and over the Million-Dollar Highway with spectacular views and fun Porsche driving roads towards Durango.



Saturday was a day on our own (a few took the time doing their own thing) or taking the famous 3.5-hour Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad train ride (many of us did this). This train ride goes into the Rocky Mountains with views of the San Juan National Forest along the Animas River, a definite step back in time.



This route originally started hauling passengers and freight (including mine ores, both gold and silver) from the mountains in July, 1882. Hollywood also filmed several movies in the area showcasing the train, such as the famous scene in the movie *Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid* where they jumped off a bridge into the raging river below.



The weather was cool with sprinkles of rain throughout the day, but the train ride itself was most interesting. The group basically had an entire closed car versus the open cars. It was nice to be enclosed as the temperatures for the day hovered around the 60s, +/- a few degrees. Once reaching Silverton we had a couple of hours to shop, find some lunch and walk around this quaint, historic mining town before returning to Durango by a deluxe motor coach. This tour ended with a Saturday night dinner at one of Durango's famed hotels, the Statler Hotel.
