Speed Bump - Slow Down For Some Automotive Tales

Tucson Auto Museum

Wayne Gould answered the phone when I called the Tucson Auto Museum, otherwise known as Wayne's Toys. "I'm sorry I can't talk to you very long. I won't be back in town until after the first of October. I will have my manager, Courtney Carr, call you for follow up."

"But I have to tell you about the two cars I just bought." He sounded as excited as a ten year old who had just found the Match Box toy car he was looking for.

"I was at the Worldwide Auction in Auburn, Indiana where I found a 1929 Duesenberg and a 1937 Packard Limousine that had been owned by Jack Benny. You remember him, don't you?" (I thought; did my voice sound that old?) "They will be delivered soon. I'll talk to you when I get back."

An article in the 2016 issue of the Arizona Jewish Post gives some background on Gould. After he sold his steel bar manufacturing business back east, his interest in cars increased. Gould said, "It started out as a man cave... I wanted to pick up a couple of cars as a hobby... I ended up with more than a couple. Of course, when you have cars, you need a building and when you have building you need to fill it. I ended up with 15 cars and then we moved here, and I needed to fill it up again."

The Tucson Auto Museum started in 2016 and is now a nonprofit organization. It is located in a renovated 22,000 sq. ft. building at 990 S. Cherry Ave., just north of 22nd St. It will reopen on October 20th, 2022.

The number of cars is in flux at the present time. Usually there are 60 to 70 vehicles that range from the best of American muscle cars to rare and exotic foreign models. From a 1955 Desoto Fireflight Convertible to a 1963 Tatra 2-603. And don't forget the Batmobiles.

I have enjoyed talking with manager Courtney Carr, who has a master's degree in History and Museum Management. She now enjoys her father's 1946 Plymouth Special Deluxe.

Courtney filled me in on some of the changes taking place. By the opening date, they hope the new air conditioning will be finished and the new acquisitions will be in place.

After a little Google search, I found that the Worldwide Auction in Auburn, Indiana, from September 1st-3rd, 2022, was on YouTube. So, I skimmed through those three days and found out how much Gould paid for the following cars:

- 1999 Plymouth Prowler - \$26,500
- 1970 Studebaker Avanti - \$14,000
- 1968 Fiat 500 - Unknown
- Small Race Car, Red Star, from Tric Engineering for a Charlie's Angels movie - \$14,000
- 1929 Duesenberg Model J Arlington Sedan - \$857,500
- 1937 Packard Twelve Model 1507 Formal Sedan - \$120,000

The Duesenberg had been shipped from the French collector Antonio Chopitea in Paris. It was reasonably priced considering that a 1929 Duesenberg Model J Convertible Coupe sold for \$3,395,00 at the same auction.

The radio and TV comedian Jack Benny bought the '37 from the L.A. Packard Showroom. With its 445.5 cubic inch engine it was reputed to be quicker and smoother than a Duesenberg. Thirteen hundred Twelves were sold in 1937, many to other movie stars. Benny is said to have traded it in on a 1949 Buick Sedan.



The Packard had been restored in the late 1970s by Hill and Vaughn in Santa Monica and came from the Rockhound Collection.

Courtney says the following vehicles will be moving on to other collectors or auctions to make room for the new arrivals: 1960 Nash Metropolitan, 1951 Hudson Pacemaker, 1955 Desoto Fireflight, 1955 Pontiac Star Chief, 1963 Ford Thunderbird, and a 1962 Chrysler 300. One that had gone previously was a 1989 Porsche 930 Slantnose.

The Museum took the '66 Batmobile to the Tucson ComicCon on September 2nd. Courtney said it did not handle well and the body shook and rattled. Look for the '55 Cadillac Custom Limo and the '63 Tatra 2-603 at the Tucson Classics Car Show at Gregory School on October 16th.

The Museum will be open Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 10 to 2. Admission is \$10 and \$8 for Seniors and Veterans. Check out their website to see all of the collection. All vehicles are kept drivable. www.tucsonautomuseum

We will fulfill our community commitment with an Adopt-a-Roadway event on **Saturday October 22nd**. For many years our club has been committed to the Adopt-a-Roadway program as a very effective means of demonstrating our continued support to our community. 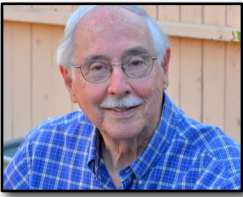

Beverly Hills Motoring Custom fit car cover.

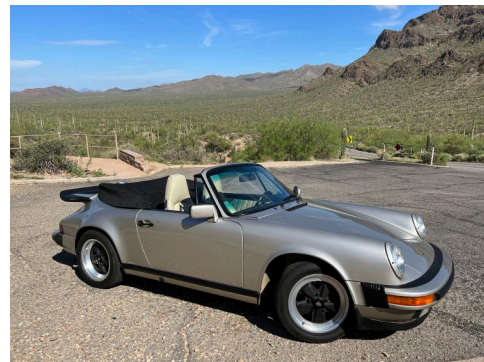
