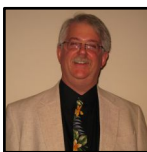

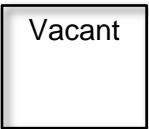

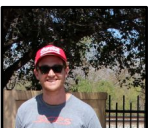

She had been driving down Interstate 5 in her Porsche Speedster when a sudden back up caused her to get on the brakes too quickly and spin out of control. Fortunately, she did not hit anything but was very shaken and had to pull off to the side of the road to calm down. She decided right then and there she needed to learn to control her car better! San Diego Region had regular Driving Schools at the time and she signed up for the next one. Sure enough, the next time she spun her Speedster was on the skid-pad at the school. She learned how to safely recover from a spin, and, more importantly, how to avoid one in the first place.

I encourage you to consider signing up for the Car Control Clinic. Even if you have no interest in participating in speed events, knowing some tricks for safely driving your Porsche and avoiding situations like my friend's experience on Interstate 5 could be lifesaving. Besides, you can also have a lot of fun!

# Treffen Bend - Touring the Cascades

Jim and I went to Treffen Bend. So, you might ask “What is the attraction about Treffen?” For us it’s the size, no competitions, people, and locations.

We had never been to Oregon, and it was one of two states left on my Tour of the US list. Treffen is a much smaller-scaled event than Parade. The participants are housed in one hotel as opposed to possibly being spread among various hotels in the vicinity. Treffen is a social event that includes driving tours and, possibly, walking/ bus tours.

It began on Wednesday afternoon with check-in (time to pick-up information and pre-ordered items and, also, sign waivers) followed by a welcome social. The next three days were filled with driving tours and Navigator’s Day Off (NDO). The tours are all pre-selected.

We signed up for the following tours:

- \* Thursday: Smith Rock / Crooked River Tour
- \* Friday: McKenzie Pass Scenic Byway Tour
- \* Saturday: High Desert Museum and Local Pour Tour



On our NDO day, Jim selected a pour tour. We were picked up at the hotel and our first stop was the High Desert Museum where we had a short tour of the facility and then we were allowed to tour on our own. They had a resident porcupine, fox, river otters, and some birds. The porcupine was a little sleepy when we first visited her so, we moved onto the recovering fox. What a beautiful specimen. He had been hit by a car and was recovering from a broken hip. Unfortunately, he can never be



returned to the wild as he would not survive with his injury. His enclosure, as all the others, was spacious and well-appointed from a nature perspective. Each space was set up to encourage exercise and reduce boredom.

After our time at the museum, we went to Bend Cider Company. It is a very small cidery that uses only natural, locally sourced ingredients in their adult beverages. We had four samples of their beverages. I liked two and Jim liked them all. My favorite was the citrus blend. We enjoyed chatting with fellow tour goers.

We then proceeded to our lunch stop at a brewery and then had a very abbreviated tour of the facility. I was impressed with our tour guide being able to fill in for the establishment’s tour guide when she backed out. We enjoyed our lunches, and the tour members liked the beer.

Our next stop was Oregon Spirit Distillery, a local distillery. They make bourbon, vodka, and liqueurs. The tour was informative. I was impressed with the cleanliness, their equipment, and the depth of knowledge their facility guide provided.





## Treffen continued

Many Treffen participants opt out of picking an activity on NDO day. They choose to look around on their own or take several of the guided tours as self-guided. Participants can get instructions from the Treffen info desk.

Socializing activities included: Breakfast each morning; catered dinners on Thursday and Saturday nights provided by the hotel; music lounge sponsored by Princess Cruise Lines; and a social on the lawn with live music on Friday afternoon.

During our stay at Sunriver, we were lucky enough to be lodged next to Kay Sullivan and Riley Jackson. They drove their new Panamera Sports Turismo to Bend from their home in southern Arizona. See Kay & Riley's impression of Treffen Bend below.

Jim and I flew into Redmond the day before Treffen started and stayed two extra days to explore. We visited Newberry National Volcanic Monument. Newberry Volcano is, by volume, the largest volcano in the Cascade Range. Its size is 75 miles north to south and 27 miles east to west. It is roughly the size of Rhode Island. The actual monument is located just north of Sunriver, the resort where Treffen was held. We visited the obsidian fields and the falls on Monday on our way back to Redmond from Crater Lake. We spent approximately 24 hours at Crater Lake. It was spectacular. On Sunday it even snowed at one of the viewing sites.

So, in short, we had an excellent time at our sixth Treffen. If this sounded like fun, consider attending a Treffen of your own. Pre-plan your activities and choose backups prior to the day of sign-up. Most Treffens sell out in the first 15 minutes.

Treffen Bend was our sixth Treffen event, and we really enjoyed it. Each one is wonderful in its own way, but the one in Austin, Texas is still at the top of my list. I believe 130 vehicles arrived at the Sunriver Resort to participate. There was concern that the smoke from the Cedar Creek fire would affect us, but it began dwindling and didn't impact us. It did, however, create spectacular sunsets that we enjoyed from our balcony with a glass of wine. The resort has been remodeled and it was a lovely setting.



Driving our brand new Panamera Sports Turismo made the three-day trip from Tucson to Sunriver Resort an absolute pleasure. Imagine the handling of a sports car combined with the luxury and comfort of a larger car. Then add 440 horsepower driving through deserted Nevada roads. We were happy not to get caught at exhilarating speeds.

Our excursions, some of the same as the Kendler's, were on different days so we didn't do things together except have a couple meals and casual encounters. We were the only two couples from the Southern Arizona Region at this Treffen. Riley and I chose the McKinzie Pass and the

So, we had hot soup at the park restaurant and went on our way without doing the loop tour. We will go another time to see that beautiful place.

We love going on our road trips but are always happy to get home again.

# Car Control Clinic

## Sunday, December 11<sup>th</sup>

### Musselman Honda Circuit

This event is for new drivers or seasoned drivers, as well as those who want to improve their driving skills. The one-day event is spent learning, practicing, and experiencing car dynamics through a series of 3 key skills, all of which require you to learn to look ahead while driving.

1) **Smooth Steering on a Slalom Course** - Understand how to navigate your car smoothly through a set of cones. Recognize where you want your car to go. You will learn how to drive where the cones aren't.

2) **Threshold and Trail Braking** - Learn how to control your car in an emergency situation. You will understand more about your car's capabilities and how to manage them. Learn how to successfully maneuver around obstacles (just as if you have a deer in the headlights) while slowing your car.

3) **Skid-Pad Activities** - Drive on a skid-pad where you will have the opportunity to experience your car breaking traction and then learn how to regain traction in a safe environment. Feel the balance and learn how to steer your car with the throttle.

4) **Autocross** - After the car control clinic we are offering the rest of the afternoon as a complete autocross so that you can practice and test your newly learned skills.

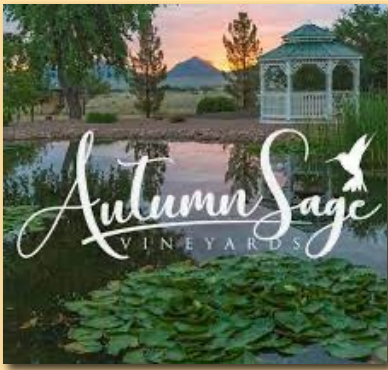

Test Drive is a program where non-Porsche owners may join for a limited time while searching for a Porsche. Currently, it's a one-year period.

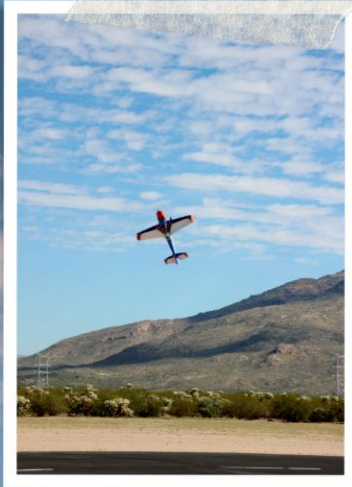
