Tour to St. Anthony's Monastery

The day was perfect for a drive when a group of about 30 SAR members met at Beyond Bread on Oracle. After our safety briefing, we headed out to St. Anthony's Greek Orthodox Monastery. The Monastery was established in 1995 when the land was purchased between Phoenix and Tucson. It is equidistant from both cities. If you are

heading to it from Tucson, it's about 10 miles before Florence off of Route 79.

Once we were parked, everyone had to comply with strict dress requirements.

Men: long pants, long sleeve shirt, socks and shoes. Caps/hats must be removed in chapels.

Women: Long sleeve shirts, long skirt or dress, scarf to wrap around and cover hair, and tied under chin. Shoes and socks. Pants or shorts can be worn under skirt.

It was harder for the women to met the criteria. No skin could be exposed except face and hands. Some skirts and shirts were deemed "too" snug and shoes had to have very low heels. Don't fret, there were clothing

items to loan to us. I could tell this wasn't their first rodeo. I was very happy this wasn't an unusually warm day. We had so many clothes covering us, I am convinced I would have roasted to death if we went later in the year. Kurt picked the perfect time and mother nature gave us good, pleasant weather.



After everyone was properly attired, we assembled for a short discussion with monk Nicholas. He gave us some history and answered questions. We then were set

> loose to explore the monastery, minding the Keep Out signs and staying out of the working fields. If I do this again, I think two hours is a good time block to allot oneself to take in all the history and architecture.

> The grounds and buildings are beautiful. We had a great day which was capped with a Greek lunch in Florence at Mt. Athos.




