

The Awards Dinner



How to Whitelist in Gmail

- 1. Click the gear icon in Gmail and select "See all settings" from the Quick settings menu.
- 2. Navigate to "Filters and Blocked Addresses" in the top menu.
- 3. Select "Create a new filter." ...
- 4. Add a specific email or a whole domain in the "From" field. ...
- 5. Click "Create filter." ...
- 6. Check "Never send it to Spam" in the checkbox.

How to Whitelist in comcast

- 1. Log in to your Comcast email account.
- 2. Within your inbox, click on the "Address Book" tab,
- 3. Click "New Contact."
- 4. Input the email address you're whitelisting, and
- 5. Click "Save."

How to Whitelist an Email in Yahoo

- 1. Open Yahoo Mail and log into your account.
- 2. Navigate to "Settings" then click "More Settings."
- 3. Select "Filters" and hit "Add" to enter the email you'd like to whitelist.
- 4. Name the filter and add the email address.
- 5. Select to send all mail to "Inbox."
- 6. Save your settings.

Tour to Fairbank By Jack Alexander - Photos by Hal Tretbar

On Saturday, April 22nd, Kurt Fuerstenau led a Porsche group of 16 cars (including a brand new GT4) and 26 people to Fairbank, AZ. On a perfect "top-down" spring day we started from Sahuarita and proceeded on back roads through Sonoita and south of Sierra Vista to Fairbank. A distance of 70 miles.

Fairbank is deemed an abandoned site. That is, buildings are standing but there is no population. Fairbank was settled around 1883 and abandoned in the 1970's. It is now maintained by the BLM. It was settled when the railroad came through. It brought supplies to Tombstone and was a departing point for silver ore from the area's mines. Later, ranching, farming, and copper from Bisbee became more prominent. The population peaked at 478 people in 1890. The San Pedro River is nearby. Our group was treated to a narrative provided by a docent regarding the history of Fairbank. The narrative was conducted in the only fully restored building, a one room schoolhouse whose restoration was completed in 2007. Most of us remembered the desks with attached chairs. The desks had ink wells! We took a short hike to the San Pedro River and up the hill to the cemetery.

Next, Kurt led us through Elgin and wine country. There were many wineries and many tasters at each one. After 34 miles, we ended up in Sonoita and ate at the Copper Brothel Brewery before taking our separate ways home. A special thanks to Kurt for a well-planned and enjoyable day.


