

My husband, Pat, has always been the driver in the family. I am usually content to sit comfortably in the passenger seat, enjoying the scenery and using my navigation skills to get us wherever we are going.

But occasionally, I want to be in the driver's seat myself. Back in February, I got my opportunity as I finally decided to take the plunge and try a High Performance Driver's Education Event at Arroyo Seco Raceway in New Mexico.

I'm not completely new to Driving Events. Back in the 1990s, when we were members of the San Diego Region, I participated in their monthly autocross series. But an autocross is not a DE. Instead of a parking lot with a course laid out in orange cones, a DE is held at an actual raceway with many more high-speed corners and technicalities.

The purpose of a DE is in its name – *Education*. As a novice driver, I was assigned an instructor. I lucked out and was assigned our President, Greg Curtiss, as my instructor. Greg started by talking with me about my previous experience and discussing my goals for the day. We looked at the course map and discussed the various ways to enter and exit the turns, where to find the apex, and where the passing zones were. I was ready to hit the track!

My first lap was a bit intimidating. This was definitely not an autocross course! Instead of tight turns and slow speeds, I had more room to really accelerate and attack the corners with some speed. I enjoyed some of the twisting "S" turns and the long sweeper turn leading into the main straight.

With Greg's patient encouragement I braked later, took the corners faster, and surprised myself with how much fun I had. This is really the way my Boxster is meant to be driven! By the end of the day I was exhausted, but thrilled with my accomplishments.

If you have never attended an HPDE Event, I highly encourage you to give it a try. Where else can you push your Porsche to the limits in a safe, encouraging venue? And there is no need to watch out for our friendly law-enforcement personnel – it is all completely legal!

Although Driving Events are put on hold during the heat of summer, be sure to look out for several events next Fall. There will be DEs at INDE in September and Podium Club in October. Our neighbors to the North, the Arizona Region, will put on both of these events and we are always welcomed to join.

### More Fun at Arroyo Seco Raceway!










The guest artist, America Merideth, was an enthusiastic speaker regarding her Cherokee heritage, and her love of art.

### **Project Corner**

### **A Few Updates and Shared Solutions**

#### **UPDATES**

First, let me give you some updates on the projects I've been writing about.

#### **Thumbelina**

I ran out of time for the giant wish list of things to do preparing the 944 S2 to return to the racetrack. I had to prioritize what was needed to get safely back on the track, and other work that could wait.

Something I noticed while going over everything is that some of the safety gear is expiring. This is the last year for a number of items. But getting back on the track will take priority.

As of this writing, all the issues to return to racing have been addressed: Thumbelina is running! And I am on my way to beautiful La Junta, Colorado for an SCCA Race. If all goes well this weekend, I will have run a few more races, and likely a new list of items to address. Hopefully, you can see Thumbelina at the Cinco Concours.

#### **Betty**

As a 2005 model year Boxster, Betty is interesting to buy parts for. 2005 was a split year. As the first year of the new model - 987, instead of the 986 - some parts match the earlier cars (986s) and some match the 987 Caymans

and Boxsters. Toss in the fact that some parts are also from the 997, and buying parts to do your own work can be an adventure. Unfortunately, the rear brake pads I had ordered look to fit an earlier Boxster. I had to re-order the later ones.

#### Mirage

Sometimes it's the little things. In this case, it was the melted front brake pad sensors on our 2008 Cayenne GTS. I knew the pads were getting close to replacement, but I put too much faith in those silly little sensors. The older Porsches don't even have sensors on the brake

pads, so this is one that I should have caught with a regular inspection.

Sometimes you actually can have too much of a good thing. I was running a pretty aggressive set of brake pads on Mirage, and while they had amazing stopping power, the pads chewed up the front rotors. This time around I am going a little less aggressive but reserve the right to bump things up again.

#### SOLUTIONS/SUGGESTIONS

You may have noticed that this column isn't always about implementing a procedure that is straightforward and results in a smooth-running vehicle with little drama along the way. Working on our Porsches is always a treat, but I do find myself in need of new ways to get things done. This month, I've touched on a few problems encountered, and it might be helpful to share my solutions and suggestions.

### Pending/Planned Work:

Take notes after each event. A good number of us already take notes about the track sessions, or possibly what you worked on with an instructor. If you write down what parts might need attention, you'll have a better chance of remembering what needs attention soon, or at least before the next track day. Even if you are washing your Porsche after one of our tours, this is an excellent time to look for worn tires, brakes that need attention, or cracked lenses on the lights. As a bonus, take a minute when parking your vehicle to walk around and check all the lights are functional and bright.

### **Keeping Track of Parts:**

I keep notes on all our vehicles right on my phone, each car having its own entry in the contacts/phone book. I like to put tire sizes, spark plug part numbers, torque specs for wheel lugs, and even when the registration expires. I'm not super consistent across all vehicles, but it can be handy when you are parts shopping without your Porsche along for reference. This might be a bit overkill for most folks, but I will be adding the brake pad model numbers so I won't buy the wrong parts in the future. Just having the year, model, and VIN number is a good starting point.

### **Expiration Dates:**

Much like the other things I take notes on for the cars, I will be adding tracking of the expiration dates on the safety equipment for the race car. I expect there will be an article or two dealing with the expired safety

equipment near the end of this season. While this isn't applicable to most, you could keep track of when the brakes were bled last, the latest service, or when you got new tires. Again, this is handy in the notes section of my phone book/contacts entries.

### **Unexpected Brake Wear:**

As I hinted about earlier, self-inspections are the easy way to reduce the problems with your brakes. Most of our Porsches have wheels that allow at least a little peek at the brakes. The first thing to look for is the brake disc itself. It should be reasonably smooth and shiny from wear. Next, try to get a peek at the brake pads. This one is a little harder to describe and a flashlight will make it a bit easier. You want at least 3/8" of pad compound (the part that wears as it stops your car). Remember not to count the steel backing plate. If you would like help learning what you want to look for, any of our wonderful tech inspectors, or myself, can help point out what you are looking for.
