At a recent get-together, Rich Kepner handed me a box. "I think you might enjoy these," he said to me. "They are a bunch of old ZNs." Sure enough, the box was a treasure trove, at least to an editor like me. It was full of old copies of the ZN, going all the way back to the 1980s.

I spent several hours perusing the old issues. There were stories of old events, names of people I recognized but had never had the pleasure of meeting, pictures of members I now know well (but looking a lot younger...). I saw Zone 8 events I remembered attending as a San Diego Region member, not knowing I would someday be an Arizonan. I wondered, how many others might enjoy this walk down memory lane?

So, I decided to start a new column. Each month I'm going to pick an issue out of this treasure trove and share it with all of you. This month, from 46 years ago, I present to you one of the oldest ones in the box, the issue from April, 1980.



Bill Boyton was our President back then and Dee Rosado was the ZN editor. The issue was typed on a typewriter, and the cover was a hand-drawn illustration depicting Dave and Lee Henry's driving trip to Guadalajara, Mexico, in their 356, which was also the main story in the issue.

Dave and Lee's story was very interesting as he described heading South on New Year's Eve and experiencing everything from burros to giant potholes to scenic canyons. My favorite part was the last paragraph:

2,600 miles later we reentered the USA, dusty and very tired, but elated. We had no trouble with customs and were soon on the beautiful four lane highway to Tucson. We had made it! But something was amiss, and within 10 miles we realized what it was about American roads that we had missed in Mexico: utter boredom.

How true! Driving the Interstates is still such a boring experience. I guess we Porsche drivers never change.

A few other interesting tidbits from April 1980 – Prices for the Time Trial at Willow Springs were only \$35 for two full days at the track. The local dealer was Bob Lewis Porsche/Audi on Speedway. He was selling Porsche genuine leather key fobs for only \$6.00. The club had a fun wine-tasting event in February (Hmm, I see a trend as this 2026 edition also has a story about a wine tasting event!) A heated topic of discussion was the impending new law requiring seatbelts in all cars and how that might affect Concours judging in cars that did not have seatbelts as part of the original equipment. The author was also concerned about the intrusiveness of government into individual safety decisions. Funny how 46 years later not having seatbelts in cars is unthinkable, but we still find reasons to complain about the government!

I hope you enjoyed this trip down memory lane. Next month I hope to find another interesting old issue to share with you.

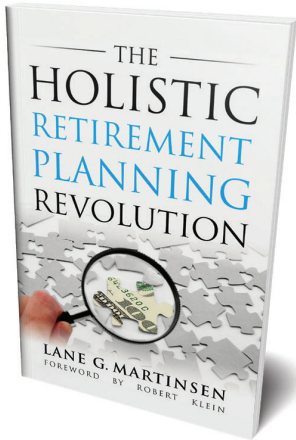
